ONE woman was killed and 21 injured when lightning struck a thatched rondave village near Matatiele shortly after a funeral on Sunday, police said yesterday.

Captain Solomon Sontebu, of the Matatiele Police Station, said the woman, iden Ndzimande, 70, burnt to death and five other people were rushed to the local houritical condition after suffering burns.
